# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (#9) BETWEEN PETALUMA CITY (ELEMENTARY) AND JOINT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND

#### PETALUMA FEDERATION OF TEACHERS

The Petaluma City Schools District ("District") and The Petaluma Federation of Teachers ("PFT") agree to the following Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") related to **Article XI - Class Size** effective July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025.

#### A. Elementary Staffing Ratio

- 1. Effective July 1, 2022 the language in Article XI regarding staffing ratio for Elementary shall read as follows:
  - a. Elementary Staffing Ratio: The District staffing ratio in grades TK to three (3) shall be twenty-four to one (24:1). For grade span adjustment purposes and schools subject to education code section 42238.02, the average school site TK-3 class enrollment shall not exceed 25 to 1.

### B. <u>Secondary Staffing Ratio</u>

- 1. The following class size limits will be implemented beginning on July 1, 2022. Class size limits will be evaluated each year after the 10<sup>th</sup> day student count.
  - a. The District will continue to develop staffing in the spring based on the current staffing ratios outlined in the PFT contract.
  - b. Regular class unit members will have an overall class size average of 32 students; the contact load shall not exceed 160 students. No more than two sections will be larger than 32 with a class size limit of 33.
  - c. High school physical education class unit member load at the comprehensive high schools shall be 155-200 student contacts per day. No more than two sections will be larger than 40 with a class size limit of 41.
  - d. Junior high physical education class unit member load shall be a maximum of 175 student contacts per day. No more than two sections will be larger than 36 with a maximum of 37 students per section, to accommodate Special Day Class students at the junior high schools.
  - e. If a unit member exceeds the current contract class limits (currently 32, 40, and 36) after the first ten days of enrollment in any class, they will receive a stipend of \$5 per student over the current contract maximums per day.

This MOU is non-precedent setting and shall sunset June 30, 2025 unless the parties mutually agree to extend in writing.
