

# Field Trip and Parent Driver Guidelines

Thank you for sharing your time with us by volunteering to drive on field trips. We really do appreciate your help.

#### Field Trip Driver Requirements

The following requirements must be met in order to drive:

- Possess a valid California State driver's license and be 25 years of age or older, or the parent of one of the students traveling on the field trip. Drivers with any history of reckless, drunk, drug or other illegal offense will not be allowed to drive on any field trips.
- · Provide proof of liability insurance as specified by the Petaluma City School District.
  - o \$100,000/\$300,000 Bodily Injury or \$300,000 Combined Single Limit
  - o \$50,000 Property Damage Liability
  - o \$5,000 Medical Payment
  - o Uninsured Motorist Coverage

Note: policy holder's name and policy period must be included (sample attached)

- Use only a vehicle registered to the driver and on file at the school.
- Provide a vehicle in good working order with a full tank of gas and a spare tire.
- Students should not be seated in the front passenger seat if there is a front passenger seat airbag installed in the vehicle.
- Wearing seat belts is the law. All drivers and passengers must comply at all times.
   California Law states:
  - You and all passengers 8 years old or older, or children who are 4 feet 9 inches tall or taller, are required to wear seat belts.
  - Children 8 years old or younger, or who are less than 4 feet 9 inches tall, must be secured in a car seat or booster seat in the back seat.
- The following information must be submitted and kept on file at school:.
  - o Completed Volunteer Application
  - o Completed Transportation of Students in Privately Owned Vehicles form
  - Copy of valid driver's license
  - o Proof of liability insurance


In order to assure fair treatment for all and help prevent any problems which may arise, all field trip drivers must adhere to the following guidelines:

- **Do not** switch students who were assigned to your car. The student car assignments are made in advance and last-minute switching causes stress and confusion.
- **Do not** stop for or provide drinks, snacks or treats for riders. Side trips or stops of any kind are not allowed. Permission is granted to transport students to and from location to be visited **only**.
- All traffic laws must be followed.
- Please fill the car with fuel before reporting to the trip.
- Please do not run errands or stop to do errands while on the trip.
- The California **cell phone law**, which went into effect in January 2017, prohibits drivers from holding their devices in their hands for any reason. If your cell phone is on, please stop the car in a safe area before you use the phone.
- Smoking is not permitted around children at any time.
- Please stay with your car "group" while on the trip unless otherwise instructed by the teacher.
- Siblings are **not allowed** on field trips unless permission has been granted by the principal in advance.
- Friends, family members, extra persons are not allowed to attend the field trip.

All students must do the following while in the vehicle:

- Seat belts must be worn.
- All body parts must remain inside the vehicle at all times.
- Students are seated at all times.
- Keep hands and feet to self.
- Stay with the assigned car group.
- NO throwing of items in the vehicle or out of the windows.
- Leave all vehicle gadgets alone.

Please inform the teacher of any behavior problems immediately upon arrival at your destination.

#### TRANSPORTATION OF STUDENTS IN PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLES

On occasion, students in our schools will participate in activities or situations where they must be transported by private vehicle. If you can assist us by using your automobile, please read the following conditions that will need attention for arrangements of this nature.

- A. In the interest of providing for a safe transport of students in privately owned vehicles while they are traveling as part of a District sponsored event, or on District business, Administrative Regulation 3541.1 requires that an owner carry certain minimum limits of liability insurance coverage for bodily injury, property damage, and medical payments.
- B. \*\*This requirement recognizes that under current legal practice, the owner of a vehicle is expected to answer and cover any claim for injury or damage caused by his/her car, and accordingly, needs the backing of sufficient insurance to properly handle this responsibility.
- C. This requirement, in addition to other provisions of Regulation 3541.1 that govern the transportation of students in privately owned vehicles read as follows.
  - 1. The trip must be approved by the principal, who is responsible for compliance with this regulation.
  - Each passenger must be properly seated to prevent overcrowding and all passengers must wear seat belts in accord with current California laws. No more than eight (8) people properly seated are permitted in a vehicle other than a certified school bus. Students under the age of 12 are not to sit in the front seat of any vehicle equipped with a passenger-side airbag.
  - 3. Each vehicle owner must furnish evidence in writing of the following insurance coverage: \$100,000/\$300,000 Bodily Injury, \$50,000 Property Damage, or \$300,000 Combined Single Limit of Liability, Uninsured Motorists coverage, and Medical Payment coverage of not less than \$5,000.
  - 4. All drivers must have a current California Drivers License and be 21 years of age or over. The driver must affirm that they have not been convicted of reckless driving or driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol within the past five years.
  - 5. Groups of cars traveling in caravans are not permitted.
  - 6. All Adults who volunteer to transport athletes or other students must agree that there will be no smoking allowed in the vehicles at any time during the field tip.
  - 7. Vehicle shall comply with all current applicable provisions of the California Vehicle code.
  - 8. The following items must be checked prior to the field trip:
    - Minimum tread on tires
    - Working seat belts for driver and all passengers
    - · Working lights, turn signals, mirrors
    - Appropriate spare tire, highway flares
    - Normally operating engine
    - Normal mechanical systems, steering, brakes, etc.

\*\*Please note: In the event of an accident, the insurance policy of the private vehicle in which students are being transported will be responsible.


